On August 19th, we welcomed into our midst our new Vicar and Theological Education for Emerging Ministries (TEEM) Candidate, Vicar Philip Supeck, whose first sermon was preached on Sunday August 25th. Welcome Vicar Philip and we look forward to walking with you as we all grow in Christ's ministry.

As I am sure nearly everyone knows by now, Vicar Philip is on a three-year plan to gain a Master of Divinity degree from United Lutheran Seminary - Gettysburg Campus. 

But that's exactly what happened in Ukraine on July 8. Okhmatdyt Hospital is one of **Ukraine's largest facilities for children with cancer**, and it was badly damaged by Russian missiles. As soon as the attack stopped, Lutheran World Relief staff rushed to provide Support, including sharing your **LWR Mission Quilts and Personal Care Kits with families who had to evacuate** the hospital and other damaged buildings

Our annual community picnic was held on Saturday, July 6. The weather was hot and sticky, but no rain, so that was a plus! We had strong attendance and did see some new people. We had great participation from our members and friends with providing financial donations, food including pies and cake donations, as well as supplies. We also had a strong contingent of people helping to make the soup who were open to trying something different with making the soup in our church kitchen vs. the pavilion
kettle. Our conclusion is that we will continue this new approach for our chicken corn soup next year. While our picnic continues to focus on community outreach, it is also good to finish in the black. This year our profit was \$3,751. After we look at purchasing a few things to make next year's picnic better, we plan to move the remaining money, including the money that has been in the picnic fund from past years, to our BULC General Fund.

## Gearing up for Apple Dumpling Day Nov. 1, 2024

Eric Wanga, our U.S liaison for Musese, Kenya church and clinic gave the following update on the mission which our apple dumplings event/profits support.

The Musese church is doing well. We have 5 churches and are looking forward to our annual meeting in August this year. We are raising \$2000 to restart our school. Our former teachers made a presentation to the Musese church leadership board on their proposal along with parents who say "their children were fed spiritually and physically" and they hope and pray for us to make a difference again. Side note: the school has been closed since the Kenya Government embraced a Chinese curriculum which was too burdensome and expensive to use in this church school setting.

The medical clinic has been embraced by the community. The harassment from the county medical personnel stopped with the official registration of the clinic. 350 to 500 patients are seen monthly. Lititz United Methodist Church sponsorship along with Brickerville apple dumpling sale pays for 2 doctors, nurses and lab techs. Medication and lab supplies have made the clinic a place of choice for the local community as well as those who travel an hour by motorbike for treatment.


Thank you very much, church, for touching many lives in Kenya. My mother is alive today because Musese clinic figured out what hospitals could not. She is diabetic. The well is still a reliable source of water. We have had visitors come to church because they came for water and saw the church building. We have a new church caretaker. He has knowledge of animals. The cows are healthy and produce a good amount of milk which gives us money to pay wages.
